STUDENT QUALIFICATIONS

Flinn Scholars:

- Typically rank in the top 5 percent of their graduating class
- Typically attain at least a 3.5 grade point average
- Earn strong SAT or ACT scores*
- Participate and demonstrate leadership in a variety of extracurricular activities
- Secure U.S. citizenship or legal permanent residency by time of entry to university
- Are residents of Arizona for the two years prior to entering the university



Candidates are evaluated on:

- Evidence of intellectual capacity, emotional maturity, defined personal goals, and understanding of their roles and responsibilities in their communities
- High performance in coursework; enrollment in academic enrichment programs such as AP, IB, or university-credited courses; independent study or research; and test scores
- Evidence of motivation to learn extending beyond grades or school requirements
- Substantive involvement and leadership in school and civic activities
- Demonstration of concern for the well-being of others expressed through community service
- A pattern of accomplishment and behavior that suggests likely future achievement and contribution to the greater good

HOW TO APPLY

- The full cost of tuition and mandatory fees, plus room and board, for eight semesters at ASU, NAU, or UA
- A three-week overseas group seminar, plus funds for at least one more summer or semester of international study-related travel
- Supplementary scholarship funds to complete an off-campus professional internship
- Personal mentoring from university faculty, community members, and Flinn Scholar alumni
- Field trips, lectures by distinguished speakers, and other group activities
- Fellowship in a community of engaged, high-achieving students

The Flinn Scholarship application, completed entirely online, is typically available in late August at www.flinnscholars.org. The application deadline is in mid-October. Application invitations are mailed to seniors whose scores on the PSAT, SAT, or ACT exams meet baseline eligibility criteria; high-school counselors throughout Arizona also receive information. Students, however, do not need to be invited in order to begin an application.
